



Volunteering with SLSSC

Volunteer effort is used to help run the club and events for skaters. The cost of club operations and meets is reduced through leveraging volunteer effort. A value for time is assigned and families have the option to meet the value of their volunteer obligation either by paying the equivalent amount or contributing volunteer time – either on an ongoing or one-off or project basis.

Volunteer Requirements

The requirement for volunteering for each skater is dependent on the skaters group as follows, where one unit is equal to eight hours or \$100:

Skater Group	Number of Units	Equivalent Hours	Equivalent \$
1	2	16	\$200
2	3	24	\$300
3	4	32	\$400
4	5	40	\$500

Note that the amount above is for the first (oldest) skater in the family; rates for second + skaters in a family are 50% of the above.

A cheque post-dated to the end of the season for the dollar equivalent is required. If all or part of the amount is raised by the family, the post-dated cheque is destroyed.
